San Jose couple celebrates 70 years of marriage

At a Polish wedding, the first toast and song is called "Sto lat" which literally translated means "one hundred years." "Sto Lat" is sung by the guests and signifies 100 years of good health for the bride and groom.

Alexander Trznadel, 90, and Jean Granowicz Trznadel, 91, were married June 15, 1941, and recently celebrated their 70th wedding anniversary.

First generation Polish-Americans who were wed at Our Lady Queen of Apostles Church in Detroit, Mr. and Mrs. Trznadel (pronounced TRIZ-nah-del) met in 1939 while both were employed at Sanders Confectionary Inc.

The brand still exists and is best known in the midwestern United States for its ice cream, cakes and candies. Alexander and Jean both worked in the company's kitchen. During a company outing, they met and began dating.

Three years after they were wed, in 1944, Mr. Trznadel began service in the U.S. Navy during WWII and was stationed in the Philippines.

The daughter of a cozak in Russian-controlled Poland, Mrs. Trznadel left her job at the candy company—and like many women throughout the U.S. at the time—began supporting the war effort by making defense machinery parts at a nearby Chrysler facility.

After the war ended, Mr. Trznadel returned home to Detroit, began designing automobile components and bought his young family's first home in 1946 for \$7,828.

In 1961, the lure of the rocket industry brought the Trznadels to California, where Mr. Trznadel accepted a position at United Technologies and designed fuel valves on Saturn rockets.

He transitioned to the computer industry in 1971 and remained there until retiring in 1984. Mrs. Trznadel organized leisure tours for seniors.

Throughout their marriage, they have remained active, enjoying swimming, bocce ball and bowling, and have been involved in the Knights of Columbus as well as activities supporting Presentation High School and Bellarmine College Preparatory, both in San Jose.

San Jose residents for more than 50 years, the Trznadels have two children, Barbara Gregory, 56, and Grace Thomson, 54, and three grandchildren, Victoria Gregory, 28, Carolyn Gregory, 26 and Alexander Gregory, 20.

After spending most of the last century together, the Trznadel s attribute their long-standing and loving relationship to the basic tenets of understanding, respect and compatibility.

"You can't always control what life experiences you have, just how you deal with them," Alexander said. "In any relationship, it is a lot of give and take. However, if you give more than you take, you can overcome any problems."

Jean added, "Life is what you make it: be calm and understanding of each other's problems, and never go to bed angry!"

I again got this from agingcare.com the author is Marlo Solitto. This outlines recommendations for a properly balance exercise program.

Cardio/Endurance Exercises Physicians recommend 30 minutes of cardio respiratory endurance exercise each day for your elderly mom or dad. This means getting the heart rate up and breathing faster. Walking, cycling and swimming are all examples of cardio/endurance exercises. If the elderly person tires easily and for those just starting to exercise, it is OK to do three 10-minute periods of exercise.

Cardio respiratory endurance exercise increases the body's ability to deliver oxygen and nutrients to tissues and to remove waste over sustained periods of time. After exercising consistently for a few weeks, there will likely be an improvement in the person's ability to exercise and ability to perform everyday tasks without getting winded and out of breath

Strength/Resistance Training Strength training uses and strengthens muscles with repetitive motion exercises. Your elderly parent can do strength training with weights, resistance bands, nautilus machines or by using walls, the floor and furniture for resistance. Two to three strength/resistance training workouts a week will provide the greatest benefits. Exercise all muscle groups by doing 1 to 2 sets of 10 to 15 repetitions at moderate intensity. Progressively increase size of weights used during workouts.

Strength training helps prevent loss of bone mass and improves balance. Both of these things will help avoid falls and broken bones among seniors.

Stretching/Flexibility Exercises Stretching is vital to exercise. Stretching helps muscles warm up and cool down gradually. Stretching improves and maintains flexibility, prevents injury, and reduces muscle soreness and stiffness.

Stretching can also be a time of meditation and a time to appreciate how the body feels. Activities like yoga or Pilates can provide a good form of stretching as well as strength training because they focus on isolating and developing different muscle groups. A number of exercise programs, like yoga and Pilates, focus on developing a strong 'core,' a term which refers to the set of muscles connecting the inner stomach to the lower back and spine. Because the core muscles provide the foundation for all movement and strength, having a strong core can help with all movement, encourage better posture and reduce allover muscle pain. Of course, there are some people whose physical abilities are limited by medical conditions or frailty in the elderly. These seniors have to go about exercise more carefully than others, but don't have to dismiss it entirely. With proper instruction and guidance, the elderly can learn activities and exercises that improve mobility and reduce frailty. Especially for those who are frail, it is particularly important to be careful, but to find a way to move the body, because regular exercise greatly reduces the risk of falling and broken bones. Try exercise in a class setting with proper supervision and definitely consider swimming or another form or water exercise as it can be less jarring to the body – the local YMCA or YWCA are good places to start when looking for exercise programs that address special needs.

This last recommendation is terrific! Check out the classes available at nearby facilities. You will be surprised what's out there.

He participated in all four sessions of the Second Vatican Council, and worked on the *Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World*.

The most traveled pope in history, he covered 748,568 miles to visit his flock and engage the world. He made five pastoral visits to the USA.

His apostolic visits to 130 countries made him the most well-known person of the late 20th century.

During his reign 87 countries established diplomatic relations with the Holy See for the first time.

He was influential in the collapse of communism in his native Poland and in other countries, and in the destruction of the Iron Curtain and the Berlin Wall.

He beatified and canonized more persons than his predecessors combined: 482 saints and 1,338 beatified.

St. John Vianney, Pray for Us.

Worthy State Deputy:

I am writing to ask that you encourage every Knight of Columbus in your jurisdiction to take immediate action to support religious freedom and rights of conscience for Catholics and Catholic institutions.

The delegates at our 129th Supreme Convention in Denver in August unanimously passed a resolution pledging our support for freedom of conscience in health care. This resolution was in response to a rule recently issued by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) *requiring* almost all private health plans to cover contraception and sterilization as “preventive services” for women.

The new rule would force insurance plans to cover all FDA-approved contraceptive methods and sterilization procedures, including “emergency contraception” drugs that may cause an abortion by interfering with the implantation of a newly-conceived human being. The mandate will force individuals and groups with religious or moral objections to purchase and provide such coverage. The rule poses a serious threat to the religious freedom of both individuals and institutions.

The Department of Health and Human Service has established a period for public comment that ends on September 30th. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops is encouraging Catholics to send an email message to HHS. The Bishops are also encouraging Catholics to show their support for bi-partisan legislation, the Respect for Rights of Conscience Act (H.R. 1179 / S.1467), which would ensure that federal mandates do not violate the deeply-held moral and religious convictions of our citizens.

Please encourage every Knight in your jurisdiction to send an email message to HHS by visiting www.kofc.org/rights before September 30th. After sending a message to HHS, Knights will be automatically invited to send a message to their elected representatives in Congress, urging them to support the Respect for Rights of Conscience Act.

The Knights of Columbus will always support religious freedom as a basic civil right. No persons or institutions should ever be forced to act in a manner contrary to their moral and religious beliefs.
